**Paper Presentations**

- Each presenter is given a 30 minute window for their presentation. We ask that presenters keep their slideshows to 15-20 minutes long, in order to allow for at least 10 minutes for questions.

**Panels**

- Unless otherwise stated, each panel will be given 30 minutes for the entirety of their presentation/talk. We ask that panel discussions also allow at least 10 minutes for discussion/questions from the audience.

**Posters and Creative Displays**

- Posters and creative displays will be showcased on Thursday afternoon/evening during a two-hour long session. We ask that presenters be next to their poster/installation from 4–4:30 p.m. to answer any questions. Afterwards, presenters are free to check out the other exhibits on display.

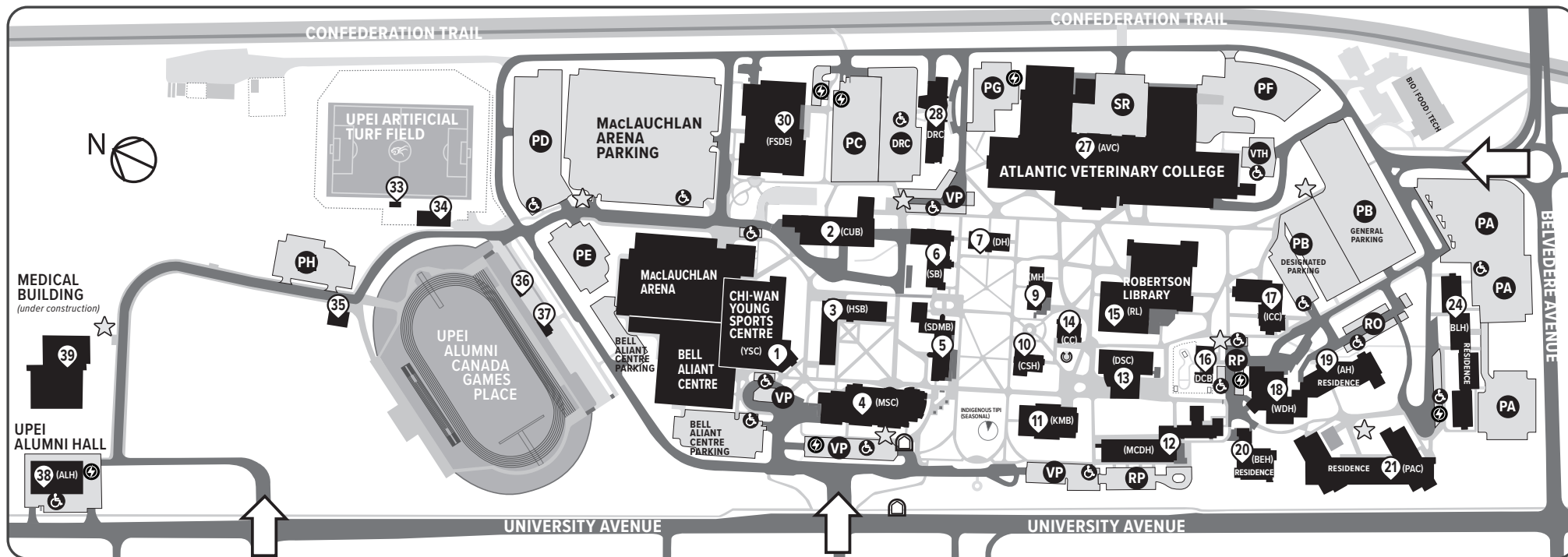
